





ADAPTIVE SPORTS

Colorado Adaptive Sports aims to bolster independence, improve self-confidence, elevate social interaction, and enhance quality of life through organized team sports for people of all ages throughout Colorado who have physical disabilities. KSC's annual funding supports 358

participants across four adaptive team sports: adaptive Rolling Nuggets Wheelchair Basketball, Colorado Sled Hockey, Rolling Mammoth Wheelchair Lacrosse, and Rolling Rapids Power Soccer teams.



BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF METRO DENVER

Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro Denver offer members a safe, supportive, fun, and enriching environment that inspires and empowers them to achieve their greatest potential. DENVER PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOUNDATION DENVER PREP LEAGUE

In 1997, KSC became a founding partner of the Denver Prep League (DPL) to give Denver Public Schools' middle school students an avenue for participation in organized after-school activities, a void left unfilled in DPS for 30 years. Today, DPL comprises 33 schools, allowing more than 7,000 students to participate in 17 different organized sports programs throughout the year. School-based physical activity programs, such as Prep

League, provide opportunities to help youth learn and practice social behaviors associated with teamwork, cooperation, and respect for others, which can favorably influence school climate, connectedness with school, and educational outcomes. Prep League encourages students to earn good grades, keep physically active, and learn about competition and sportsmanship while providing a safe and supervised environment.

GOLD CROWN FOUNDATION

Founded in 1986, the Gold Crown Foundation (GCF) strives to educate youth through sports and enrichment programs. GCF is built on three principles – participation, sportsmanship, and community. KSC's annual funding supports programs for 12,500 participants and more than 1,600 volunteers, which provide more than 35,000 opportunities for youth.



MORE THAN 35,000 OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH

SPECIAL OLYMPICS COLORADO UNIFIED CHAMPION SCHOOLS

Special Olympics Colorado Unified Champion Schools (UCS) Program empowers youth, with and without Intellectual Disabilities (ID), to be leaders of change through playing sports and learning together. The program includes four programmatic parts: Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership, Whole School

Engagement, and Inclusive Health (called the Healthy LEAP program in schools). UCS creates a channel for Special Olympics Colorado (SOCO) and schools to cooperatively work together to ensure inclusion in all school activities, equip young people with tools and training to create sport, classroom, and community

experiences that reduce bullying and exclusion, promote healthy activity and interactions, combat stereotypes and stigma, eliminate hurtful language in schools, and engage young people in pro-social activities that lead to more inclusive and accepting attitudes, behaviors, and school climates. Funding from Kroenke Sports Charities

provides opportunities for 85,000 students in 204 schools through the Denver – Aurora – Boulder area.



YOUNG AMERICANS CENTER FOR FINANCIAL EDUCATION

Young Americans Center for Financial Education's goal is for Colorado youth to grow up knowing how to earn, make, and manage their money wisely, regardless of their background. Kroenke Sports Charities funding supports Young AmeriTowne, a unique program which provides more than 31,000 Colorado 5th-grade students with immersive, hands-on learning experience in personal finance.



PLAYWORKS

Playworks' mission is to improve the health and well-being of children by increasing opportunities for physical activity and safe, meaningful play. Playworks helps schools and youth programs create healthy play environments where every child can join in. Kroenke Sports Charities' funding supports Playworks Colorado's evidence-based recess programs in 69 elementary schools, benefiting 27,000 students, with 73% from economically marginalized communities.

Denver Nuggets Community Ambassadors interact with more than 10,000 people each year. Appearances include basketball skills clinics, school assemblies, motivational speaking, and hospital visits. In 2024-25, the Nuggets Community Ambassadors included Kyle Speller, Mark Randall, and Nicholas Owens.



NICHOLAS OWENS

Nicholas Owens is an inspiration to all who meet him. His relationship with the Denver Nuggets began in 1990 when he was a child ambassador for Children's Hospital Colorado. In 1998, he was officially hired as a locker room attendant to care for the players and coaches. Nicholas was born with spina bifida, a congenital disability

resulting in damage to the nerves in the spinal cord, leading to paralysis and sensory loss. During his lifetime, he has overcome more than 40 surgeries due to various complications. Nicholas has a love for sports and for helping others; his role as a Community Ambassador perfectly melds these two passions.

MARK RANDALL

Former Nuggets player, assistant coach, scout, broadcaster, and in-arena host Mark Randall currently serves as a Community Ambassador for the team. In this role, Randall works with children to promote sportsmanship, teamwork, and basketball. Randall also serves as Manager of High School Athletics for Denver Public Schools, where he helps oversee the day-to-day logistics of 26 sports for 13 City of Denver High Schools.



TEAM FIT

In partnership with Kroenke Sports Charities and presented by Great Clips, the TeamFIT program supported and educated more than 300 students in grades 3 through 8 from local metro area schools. Those participating in the six TeamFIT sessions during the 2024-25 NBA & NHL seasons received fundamental basketball,

hockey, fitness, nutrition, and mental wellness tips and lessons from team celebrities, including strength & conditioning coaches, mascots, and current players from the Denver Nuggets and Colorado Avalanche.

GREEN ASSISTS

MOST VALUABLE TEACHER

The Denver Nuggets and Colorado Avalanche proudly celebrated the incredible impact of local educators through the 2024-25 Most Valuable Teacher (MVT) program, presented by Ford. FUTURE GOALS

In partnership with the National Hockey League and Players' Association, and powered by Everfi, Future Goals / Hockey Scholar is an education-based program designed to help students build Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math skills using hockey as a learning vehicle. During the 2024-25 season, more than 3,100 students from Colorado completed the Future Goals Hockey Scholar curriculum.



STEM ON ICE

On January 17, 2025, the Colorado Avalanche hosted 60 students from Ellis Elementary at Ball Arena for STEM on Ice, presented by Kiewit. Students participated in educational STEM stations including tours of the Ball Arena Ice Plant, Zamboni Garage, Broadcast Studio, and Altitude TV Press Box, followed by a career panel led by Avalanche staff members.

NBA MATH HOOPS

NBA Math Hoops leverages the game of basketball and the NBA/WNBA brands to build fundamental math skills through a physical and digital basketball-themed board game, a curriculum, and a community program experience. Designed for students in grades 4-8, this free program develops students' algebra readiness prior to entering high school, while strengthening important skills including self-regulation and executive function. The NBA Math Hoops program is implemented in in-school, out-of-school, and home learning environments. This program experience is managed by Learn Fresh Education, a 501-c-3 non-profit, in association with Kroenke Sports Charities and NBA Cares.



During the 2024-25 NBA season, 53 educators and 3,094 students across Colorado participated in the Nuggets NBA Math Hoops program. On March 27, 2025, the Denver Nuggets hosted 50 students from Revere School for a Math Hoops Live event at Ball Arena to bring the board game to life on the court. Nuggets player, DaRon Holmes II, made a surprise appearance for the kids and joined in on the action-packed afternoon!

Jordan Luppes from Beach Court Elementary was selected to represent the Denver Nuggets at the NBA Math Hoops Global Championship held from June 24 – 27, 2025 in New York City.






AUTOGRAPHED MERCHANDISE DONATION PROGRAM




MAKE-A-WISH

BALL ARENA 25TH ANNIVERSARY GRANTS

In honor of the 25th anniversary of Ball Arena, Kroenke Sports Charities awarded community grants to 25 non-profits in Colorado. Each non-profit received a grant of \$10,000, for a total of \$250,000 awarded to community groups, impacting 877,377 Coloradans.
